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Introduction





The activities in this book were developed for children ages six and older. They are designed to help children in their early school years by improving the following skills:

1. Directionality: The ability to recognize the proper orientation of letters; necessary to eliminate reversal errors
2. Laterality: Understanding one's right and left; necessary to eliminate reversal errors

General Directions

There are six levels of activities in this workbook, ranging from least to most difficult. All children should start with Level 1. Children should be at least six years old when they begin with Levels 1 and 2 and seven years old to continue on with Levels 3–6. Each level has its own instructions. Do not proceed to the next level until the child has mastered the current level.
