




You probably think about it pretty often, like when your belly is growling or when you smell something yummy cooking in the oven.



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
You can probably even name your favorite foods and your least favorite foods right now. But do you ever think about where your food comes from and how much it goes through before it gets to you?




Every single thing you eat has its own history. Let's learn the history of one kind of food. Let's follow the journey of an orange.
