



Richard Nixon has won every election in which he has run because he was willing to light for his convictions. There was no question where he stood.

As an unknown in politics in 1946, his winning margin was 15,592 votes. His freshman term was marked by his work on foteign aid and the Tabi-Hartley Act. The public's reaction? In 1948 he received not only the Republican backing for re-election but a Democratic majority as well. His margin: 141,509 votes.

In 1950, Richard Nison wen his Senate seat with a 680,847 margin, again with Democratic support. His 2.2 million vote topped the Republican registration of 1.9 million.



1946-1952 won threa successive terms in the House of Representatives, each by an increasingly uide margin.


1952 deleated Henry Cabet Ledge by 70,000 votes in Massachusetts asee for the U.S. Senate.

1958 broke all votegetting recents in winning re-election by 873.000 votes, carrying every city and county in Massachusetts, winning by a 2–1 margin.

1969 took his case to the scores of the country, renning in seven Presidential primaries and witning them all. Kennedy received almost two million winning votes.
