About the Cover

Many people wonder why we use the Model-T in our logo at Royal Fireworks Press. To be precise, our logo is a 1914 Ford Model-T C-cab delivery van. It is a case of art imitating life. Originally we adapted a drawing by Milton N. Kemnitz (1911-2005) of the truck, which he knew as a little boy because it was the delivery vehicle of a dry cleaner owned by a friend of his father. We chose it as our logo to suggest that we are looking back with reverence to the learning, lore, pace of life, human interaction, and many (but by no means all) of the values of previous generations. It is a fitting symbol for a company where humans still answer the phone because your call truly is important to us, and we want to treat you as we would want you to treat us.

The Ford Model-T, which was unveiled on October 1, 1908, is one of the great symbols of human ingenuity; it comes from a time when people understood the mechanical world, and most people could (and needed to) make a wide variety of repairs to the mechanical things they used. One day in 2015 we got the opportunity to buy the van pictured on the cover. It was yellow and painted with the name of a florist in Fresno, California, where it had sat in a garage for a generation after the owner's death. We jumped at the chance, bought it, and had it shipped across the country to New York, where we took it into our factory. Bill and Lil Schoonmaker, who ran our bindery at that time, undertook to convert the yellow van into the Royal Fireworks red truck. They removed every piece, polished every screw, bolt, nut, and other metal parts, and then reassembled the entire vehicle for its final painting. The importance of its year of manufacture in 1914 is that it was the last year of the brass era for Ford; subsequent models had chrome-plated electric lights instead of the beautiful brass gas and kerosene lamps of our logo.

Off the Charts is the most original and important publication on giftedness to appear in many years. The editors have brought together nineteen essays by renowned gifted educationists to produce this important publication.



Learning. Chapters describe the nature of asynchrony, methods of dealing with the challenges of asynchrony, and recommendations for adapting education in a variety of settings.

The contributors' contention is that gifted education should be from a child-centered perspective, rather than from a "product perspective," in which the emphasis is on achievement, competition, and outer recognition. The child-centered approach concentrates on self-development and personal growth and fosters interrelatedness and wholeness. This is an important resource for teachers, parents, counselors, and others concerned with the optimal development of gifted to highly gifted individuals.



The Accurate Identification of Gifted Students

Standardizing Test Results across Diverse Measures of Ability and Achievement



Giftedness comes in many forms and may not always be evident in the ways in which we expect. Using different types of assessments helps to identify as many gifted students as possible. However, many of these identification assessments are scored on scales that are specific to those tests—and also completely different from the scales used to score other tests.

Normalizing data means putting different types of data on the same scale so that they can be compared in a way that accounts for both their significance and their differences. Unfortunately, the vast majority of school districts do not normalize their student identification data, but there are

several important kinds of assessment data that don't fit well (or at all) within the common identification methods.

This book supports educators who are faced with the difficulty of including data from a variety of assessment instruments and/or multiple test cycles in their gifted identification procedures by introducing a method of converting that data into accurate, directly comparable ranking scores. With this method, educators can feel confident that they are identifying as many students as possible to provide them with an appropriately challenging education—something that all children deserve.





Yet at about the age of five, he began exhibiting pervasive symptoms of anxiety and fear that rapidly took over his life. His story is one of struggle against unknown terrors and of the love and patient care that his dog mom (a.k.a. owner) provided to bring him back to health. It is a tale of love, determination, resilience, and inspiration.

This book is emotionally rich, yet it also offers clear explanations of giftedness and twice-exceptionality for people who may be new to those topics. It presents a portrait of what being 2e can look like, but it does

so through the figure of a dog. Murphy's story presents parents and other adults with insight into some of the ways in which real people must deal with twice-exceptionality in all its complexities, but it also offers 2e children the chance to see aspects of themselves in the nonthreatening context of an animal story. Among the lessons they will learn is that, no matter how much they may struggle, no matter how exasperated their parents may feel sometimes, they are still beautiful, valuable individuals who can be the light of someone's life. There is no better lesson than that.


An Overview of the MCT Language Arts Curriculum



All of the Poodle books are fully illustrated with brilliantly creative images by artist Christopher Tice. Each volume shines even more radiantly than the last, with Book 5, in which Chris imitates the styles of some of the world's most famous artists, as a particularly dazzling achievement. They are also multisensory. POODLE KNOWS POETLY BOOK 3 OF THE POODLE SERIES

Poodle Knows Poetry opens with our favorite chicken standing alone after having left the Blue Mountain. Poodle uses his surprisingly extensive knowledge of poetic devices to negotiate with his ornery author, eventually talking the author into writing What? and Sidney into the book, but not before a few new characters join the cast and Poodle teaches us some of the most important techniques used in writing poetry.

The brilliance of this book is that Michael has written poetic devices into nearly every line so that prose and poetry become almost indistinguishable. Throughout the story, we both learn about and see in action the importance of sound, meter, and more. Poodle professes to be a poet, and although he successfully puts his money where his beak is, the author is a pretty sneaky player as well, filling the story with the very poetic techniques that he claims never to have heard of (you can't trust authors).

Again in this book the fourth wall is broken as the author and Poodle discuss and debate both poetic devices and the plot of the story, and again Maybe mouse breaks into the scene occasionally to remind everyone that this is not just a story; it's a play, and they'd best get their parts right. The book operates at several different levels, all as the drama unfolds around a lurking monster and an ominous storm brewing in the distance.

This book does so much more than impart an appreciation for poetry! It provides children with valuable instruction in how writers can make their writing not just more beautiful but also more effective at conveying the message they want to communicate—lessons that will be useful both in academia and throughout their entire lives.



Dr. Frances R. Spielhagen's Latin curriculum is the pinnacle of the natural inductive approach. Rather than being forced into translating Latin, students are challenged to absorb Latin, deriving meaning from the illustrations that go with the words and developing vocabulary and grammar gradually in the natural thread of language acquisition. The illustrations of young Cecilia, Verus, and their family were drawn by artist Christopher Tice, and images of their domestic and public life are from our own library of photographs taken at archaeological sites by Dr. Thomas Kemnitz; his expertise has informed the depiction of every detail in the illustrations, and his explanations in the instructor manuals provide background and additional information about the illustrations.


Each student book has an accompanying instructor manual. These manuals will give instructors the essential vocabulary and grammar they need to guide students through the Latin curriculum successfully. They are designed to put the onus on the students to make meaning of the words rather than on the instructor to guide translation. In *Question Mark* the central issue is: *Can we know anything for certain?* In the story, Mark helps a shadow-rabbit escape from a dog named Dogma, who is trying to eliminate uncertainty once and for all.

Black Death is based on the plague that devastated Europe in the mid-fourteenth century. The Black Death has been laying waste to one community after another, and the students have been called as government officials to an emergency meeting to decide what the people of their small town in Italy should do. They complete lessons that help them assess the level of risk they face, determine when the plague might arrive in their town, and consider what might happen if it does. The information available is only what was suspected at the time—that foul vapors carried the disease through the air, for example, instead of fleas. This creates a situation in which the students must use logic and rational thinking to try to save the townspeople against a terrifying unknown. The unit culminates with a presentation by the students to the town's Council of the Elders of a plan to keep them as safe as possible.

Problemoids engages students in high-level thinking about challenging problems and provides a stimulating opportunity for them to develop and increase their repertoire of problem-solving strategies. There are three levels of the program, for children in grades 4, 5, and 6.







In the late 1830s, an Englishman named Charles Babbage designed a computing machine called the Analytical Engine that would be, in effect, the first computer. LARS: The Lane Academic Readiness Screen



The Lane Academic Readiness Screen (LARS) is a questionnaire that is designed to identify children who may be at risk for possible academic difficulties due to reading or vision problems. This is primarily for children ages four to six, but it could be useful for children of all ages. The questionnaire is used to identify problems in directionality, laterality, gross motor skills, visual motor skills, simultaneous and sequential processing, eye tracking, and attention.

Once a child has been tested using the LARS, adults can plan a program to help address the problems identified by the results. The LARS directs users to specific packages of workbooks that contain activities

and therapy procedures that will help the child improve reading speed and proficiency.
